Shrubs and Plants Flowering in March

Here are some suggestions to get your spring garden ready.

Tulips start showing up in March. Forsythia is a welcome splash of color, reliable and very easy to grow. Daffodils bring color to gardens everywhere. Several Magnolias are suited to smaller gardens. Spiraea 'Arguta' is spring flowering, deciduous, with arching branches covered in very white flowers. Primula is a lovely spring flower with many colors and flower shapes. Allium is a showy late spring flowering bulb. Hellebore flower from winter into spring. Crocus is one of the earliest spring bulbs to bring cheer and color to the garden. Just a friendly reminder that the subdivision indenture of trust and subdivision rules and regulations require approval for some home improvements or changes you might make.

Architectural Changes that Require Trustee Approval

- New fences or replacement fences that are not placed on the existing fence line
- Sheds and utility buildings
- Gazebos
- Decks

HOME IMPROVEMENT

- Patios and pavers
- Retaining walls
- Swimming pools
- Additions to your home
- Additions to your driveway

Architectural Changes that do NOT Require Trustee Approval

- Changing color of siding, shutters, or doors
- Changing driveway from asphalt to concrete, or vice versa
- New windows or doors

- Replacement of existing non-cyclone (chain-link) fencing on the same fence line
- Replacing mailbox
- Landscaping
- Roofing shingles

Refer to the Trustees page of the Seven Pines website (www.7-pines.com) to learn how to submit requests for Architectural Change approval. The full set of Trustee Policies, as well as the subdivision trust agreement and indenture of restrictions may also be found there.

St. Louis County ordinances may require separate County approval or permits for some projects. Trustee approval is not the same as County approval, and County approval is not the same as Trustee approval. Some improvements may require both. It is the homeowner's responsibility to comply with all applicable subdivision and County rules and regulations. If in doubt, please reach out to the Trustees at trustees@7-pines.com.



Rev. of Horse by Geraldine Brooks



Geraldine Brooks weaves a fascinating story around an old, discarded oil painting of a famous thoroughbred racehorse, Lexington, and its skeletal remains that is being restored for an exhibition. This juxtaposition brings two divergent young people together; one is a Nigerian art historian, Theo, and the other a native Australian Smithsonian scientist, Jess. The body of the book is explicit in its discussion of the art world in the 19th

century and the cultural experience of living in the South pre- and post-Civil War. It is full of historical information about the early beginnings of horse racing and the lives of those own and care for race horses. We also become familiar with art vocabulary (coruscating, impasto, palimpsest, gouache, atelier) which had some of us running to the dictionary, and with the meticulous scientific process of articulating skeletons and reassembling them.

But *Horse* is more than paint and bones. It is also about ingrained racism and how difficult it is to fight against no matter what era you live in. Theo and Jess are living in the 21st century and although we no longer depend on horses to get around and we don't use coffles to enslave people, we haven't been able to eradicate the deep-rooted and subtle prejudice that remains in our lives.

Brooks includes notes of the historical connections among the people in the novel to the thoroughbred, Lexington, at the end of the book, which gives it authenticity. As always, with Geraldine Brooks, you come away just a little bit smarter than before.

Be a good neighbor and make sure the lid on your trash bin closes properly. If trash happens to spill out, please take the time to pick it up before it blows all over the street.


