



Rev. of: Still Life with Woodpecker by Tom Robins

Tom Robins is a favorite author of one of our members so in homage to his recent passing, she chose his 1980 *Still Life with Woodpecker* for our discussion. Robins has been touted as "one of the wildest and most entertaining novelists in the world" as well as "the most dangerous writer in the world." *People* claims "Robbins's comic philosophical musings reveal a flamboyant genius." This novel touches on being completely absurd to being profound. Although in general we did not praise the book, we had a lively discussion about the nuggets of his observations. He went from laugh-outloud funny to completely serious. Here are some examples:

- 1. "... unhappiness ... clung to her the way a bad dream clings to a rumped pillowcase."
- 2. Gulietta "her surname resembled a line from an optometrist's examination chart."
- 3. "we, each of us, are responsible for our own fulfillment." Leigh-Cheri
- 4. "his lips quivered like a snail that had just learned the meaning of escargot." A'ben
- 5. "what one law could change the world" Leigh-Cheri

Robins knows how to ask the questions that are still relevant forty years in the future. Even though he cloaks his message in fantasy and humor, he mixes in just enough realism to give us pause for thought. His commentary on the last 25 yrs of the 20th century hold true for the first 25 yrs of this century.

Menu: Since the only food mentioned was SpaghettiOs, wedding cake and champaign, our host opted for a 4th of July meal. We had caprese skewers, strawberries, blueberries and nuts to nosh on and a glass of champaign as we gathered for our discussion. This was followed with mouthwatering Sugarfire BBQ ribs and coleslaw. Dessert was Berry Cream Fillo Baskets. We felt very patriotic indeed!

Down the Garden Path

July kept the Garden Club busy tending to the plantings at the pool entrance driveway. As with our own gardens, the flowers are struggling with the heat and the heavy downpours of summer rain, something that doesn't seem to bother the weeds! Despite the less than favorable weather conditions, we have a lovely arrangement of purple catmint, Shasta daisies, red vincas, and white Obedient Plants.



Many people refer to **Obedient Plant** as **False Dragonhead** (pictured on left). Both **hummingbirds and butterflies** enjoy the nectar from the Obedient Plant flower. The beautiful flowers resemble snapdragons and slowly bloom from the bottom of the flower stalk upward. They open around July and should remain in bloom well into fall even through November.

We have also been busy keeping the 6 large flowerpots surrounding the pool watered and fed. Regrettably we have not been able to plant anything at the front entrance due to the electrical problem making the sprinkler system inoperable. Weeds of course are another matter.

We hope you have had a chance to visit our **Little Free Library** and have found some good reads there. We are working on a plan to decorate the library and add some plantings along with a few steppingstones to provide a dry place to view the collection.

At our July meeting we watched a 2023 recorded webinar entitled "Our Garden is for the Birds". It details how Margy Terpstra and her husband created a native oasis with just over a half-acre lot in Kirkwood. Much to our amusement, a determined yellow finch bombarded the library window trying to reach his buddies shown on the screen. Margy recommends a free booklet "Missouri Birds, Where, When, and What" to get you started on your oasis as well as downloading

When, and What" to get you started on your oasis as well as downloading a free smart phone app Merlin Bird ID by Cornell Lab to assist in identifying the birds in your own backyard. The video is available on YouTube at https://youtu.be/aWWGzGQ49m4

Things to Do in the Garden in August

- Trim, Clip, and Deadhead: Regularly trim and deadhead flowering plants to encourage new growth and prolong blooming. This also helps prepare plants for winter by allowing new growth tips to harden off.
- Save Seeds: Collect seeds from spent blooms and flowering edibles. This practice is cost-effective and promotes genetic diversity among your crops.
- 3. Adjust Fertilizer: Stop fertilizing flowering shrubs this month to prevent excessive growth that may not harden off before winter.

- 4. Patch Spotty Lawns: Repair any bare or patchy areas in your lawn by reseeding or restarting the lawn in those spots.
- 5. Order Fall Bulbs: If you plan to plant bulbs in the fall, order them early to ensure timely delivery and store them in a cool, dry place until planting.
- 6. Clean Up Tools: Take the time to clean and maintain your gardening tools to ensure they are in good condition for the upcoming seasons.
- 7. Evaluate Your Mulch: Check your mulch levels and replenish as necessary to retain moisture and suppress weeds.



By focusing on these tasks, you can ensure your garden remains healthy and productive as summer transitions into fall.

Soil Erosion in Your Backyard

Soil erosion has been a continuing problem in **Seven Pines** and it is not confined to common ground areas. Many of us are battling it in our own backyards.

The best plants for erosion control are those ground covers or shrubs that are vigorous, attractive, and have a root system effective at holding back soil on a hill. They should have **spreading foliage** to slow the velocity of heavy rain. If deer roam your yard, use plants that deer tend to resist eating. The following list gives you a variety of choices, each of which meets these criteria.

Creeping Junipers
Vinca Minor Periwinkle
Forsythia
Japanese Spurge
Spotted dead nettle

Border Grass
Black Mondo Grass
Creeping Phlox
Interrupted Fern
Rockspray Cotoneaster
